

From the Pastor's Pen...



We are coming up to the Easter celebration later this month and finishing the final weeks of Lent. It's a time in the calendar for preparation and returning to the Lord. We look to the Christ for guidance as we will follow the Christ on the way of the cross.

This way of the cross is one of surrender and one of unconditional love. Each and every day we are called surrender our lives to God as we understand God, this path is fruitful and costly. True discipleship is always costly.

One of my favorite lines from Dietrich Bonhoeffer is, "When Christ calls, he bids one to come and die." Following Christ isn't about us. It takes letting go and surrendering to the loving will of God. As we approach Good Friday, I am reminded of the last seven words of Christ especially "Today you will be with me in paradise." A criminal asks Jesus for forgiveness and to be remembered in the kingdom. Jesus forgives from the cross. This is a powerful witness and example.

Forgiveness on the cross speaks so loudly. It is possible to already forgive someone for their actions to see the error and to engage in love. Christ forgives us even though we don't know what we do. When I was a kid and still today, I deeply pondered the crucifixion of Jesus, always wondering what it meant for my life. Jesus offers us new life in his death and resurrection. The cross always assured me that Christ was with me in the darkest hours even when I didn't feel that way.

The cross opens a door for forgiveness and reconciliation. We can stand at the foot of the cross and receive forgiveness. This forgiveness allows our lives to be restored even when we make mistakes. Forgiveness is about not drinking poison, expecting the other person to die. Forgiveness is about letting love even in the most difficult of circumstances allow us to experience new life. It is an antidote to the poison of anger and hatred.

I have experienced this in my life multiple times because of what Christ has done for us. How have you experienced? What has Christ done for you? Let's ponder over these next few weeks how Christ's forgiveness is alive in our lives. Where has Christ's forgiveness changed your life and how love is a guide for our lives? Are we sharing the forgiveness?

Here is just a tease of what happens next. He is...

I won't finish that line. The cross isn't the end. It is just the beginning. Forgiveness isn't the end. It is just a beginning to new life. We will get to the rest of the story this month.
