From the Pastor's Pen...

Are we able to articulate our faith? Do we let our lives speak about who God is by our actions? As Lutherans, we are very good at realizing that we are saved by grace. It is not our own works. If God's love, grace, and forgiveness isn't coming alive in our lives, are we just paying lip service?

These are questions that I personally ponder and offer to you. Over the summer, I asked people for their gratitude's. I will continue with this until everyone who wants to say something has had a chance. It has a two-fold focus. First, it turns us to positive thoughts. Second, it makes us reflect on our faith. My goal is to continue to help individuals reflect upon and articulate their faith experiences. The question, where is God present in our life and congregation? needs to be our focus. It is not about us. It is about Christ.

Being able to articulate this is vital and important for us. As I reflect on the Franciscan calling to rebuild the church, it starts when we connect with Christ in our daily lives. It isn't only about coming on Sunday. It is allowing love and grace to lead us daily. God's love and forgiveness coming alive in our actions. It is being willing to go through the challenging work of reconciliation, not forgiving and forgetting. It is forgiving knowing that this is Christ's way.

My next effort to help people articulate their experience of God. How God brings you into wonder? It involves finding people to discuss 3-5 minutes what Advent means to them based on one of the weekly themes of Hope, Peace, and Joy. This is an effort for us to reflect and hear others encounters of faith. I would either video record you or audio record if you don't want to be on camera. This will be part of our midweek Advent devotions. Articulation and sharing helps us to encourage others through our experiences.

If you are interested in helping with this, please contact me. I would love to be able to hear your voice and help you share your voice.

What happens at the church isn't about me, it is how Christ is working through us. Faith comes alive when we open up to God's work and not our own desires. It is pretty cool!
